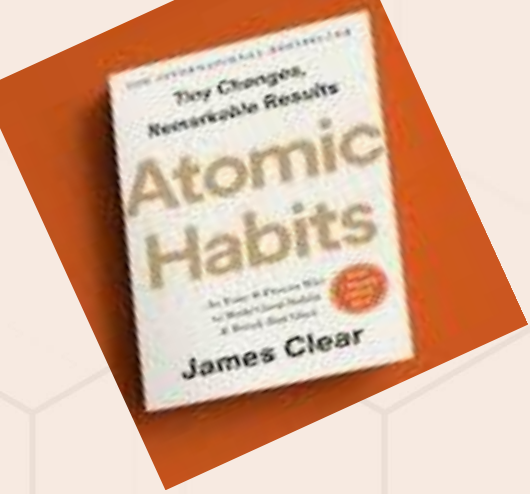


Policy Advocacy:

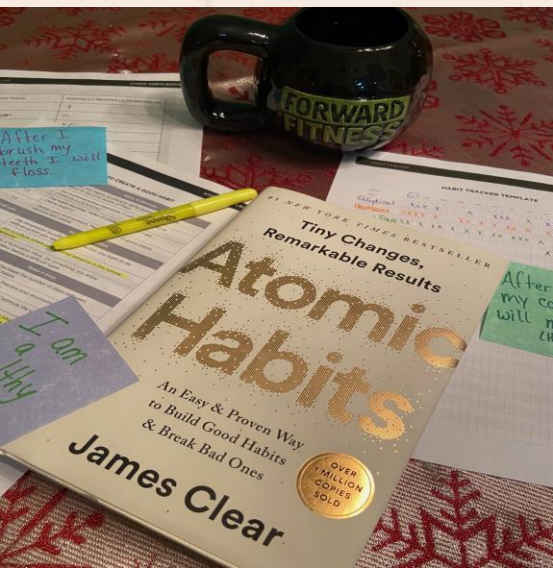
